Neptune's school trip to Cambridge

On Thursday Neptune class visited the Cambridge New Mosque and Beth Shalom Synagogue as part of their core learning for Religious Studies. Starting their day at the Cambridge New Mosque, the children were guided by a fantastic host, who offered a wealth of fascinating information including how the Mosque was designed by Emma Clark, the same architect who designed the London Eye. She showed the children their green space, which is prevalent to their eco-friendly ethos and also the beautiful calligraphy scribing on the outside of the building. Inside the Mosque, the children learned about the importance of washing hands, removing shoes and the direction of Prayer. Matilda explains, "The Mosque was so pretty – there were lots of gold and turquoise colours, and it had lovely carvings. It was also really interesting to find out about Mecca." The second part of the day saw the children visit the Beth Shalom Synagogue where they learned about the Shabbat (the special meal that Jewish people hold on a Friday night). They also had the opportunity to see the Torah scrolls. "The Torah was really lovely," explains Beau, "It was really special to see it".



Saturn class enjoyed a fascinating Egyptian workshop

Saturn class were treated to a whole-day workshop on Wednesday, all about Ancient Egypt, to further enrich their topic work. The action-packed day was a huge hit with the children and really brought the topic to life for them. Charlie reports, "I learned so much – it was a really fun day."

Some of the best and most extraordinary bits were seeing pictures of what Tutankhamun might have looked like, and also seeing canopic jars. We also got to see a real arrow head made of stone. We learned how the ancient Egyptians measure things; they used cubits, which is the length from your wrist to elbow, palms and fingers. We took turns to measure each other – I am three cubits, two palms and one finger! Another really interesting thing was learning about the animals they hunted and the way they used their spears. We did a really fun game with cardboard cut-out animals and foam javelins to see which team could 'hunt' the most animals; there was different amounts of points for each animal. Thank you for a really extraordinary and fun day!"

The Doorstop Theatre company visited school and put on an afternoon performance of singing, dancing and puppeteering. The Artsmark assessor commended Cavendish Primary by stating: “Cavendish Church of England Primary School is clearly a school that constantly strives to improve on its own personal best. The school has many collaborations with external partners, which make a significant contribution to the quality of arts and culture provision. For example, being a Royal Shakespeare Company Associated School has enabled them to access training for staff and pupils alike. The school took part in ‘The Weavers’ Project, celebrating local arts, which has supported pupils to become more aware of not only local history but also career opportunities in the Arts and creative industries. Diversity is recognised and celebrated through the Arts, with support from parents and the PTFA to visit museums, art galleries and places of worship such as Cambridge Mosque. Connections are made across the curriculum to support other areas of learning. For instance, when studying the Rise of Victorian Democracy in history, children study William Morris as part of the Arts and Crafts movement and use their earlier botanical drawing skills to develop their own nature inspired stylised wallpaper prints.”

As a school we are delighted to receive gold status recognition. Creativity and the arts are at the heart of our vision statement, and we have developed our curriculum to reflect this. It is lovely to see this recognised as a strength, and reflects the hard work of the children and staff involved.
