In Neptune class this week the children discussed and wrote a comparison between Fagin's Gang and modern day grooming. This piece of work was written by Michael, he was able to show good understanding between modern day grooming and Victorian gang culture.

I can compare Fagin's gang to modern day grooming – by Michael

Grooming is when someone decided to join a gang but the people in the gang are trying to manipulate you by giving you food and shelter. This does happen in the modern day, mainly in big towns and cities. For example a gang member might give you money or food, then afterwards they will make you earn the money by doing stuff that is dangerous or illegal. Most people who get manipulated are young children or teens between 13-16. There are other types of gangs such as drug sellers who sell drugs.

In the case of Oliver Twist, which was set in the Victorian times, The Dodger gave Oliver some bread, and introduced Fagin as a friendly man, which lowered Oliver's guard down. Fagin manipulates Oliver by

introducing pickpocketing as a game and also treating Oliver like a king. By doing this eventually Oliver was curious about why the boys were going out. So Fagin took this as an opportunity to send Oliver on a trip to work. Today most gangs are more territorial and not really a pickpocketing group, I think they are more like selling rather than taking. Any way in Oliver's case its pickpocketing but set in Victorian times, more children would be manipulated because of the industrial revolutions and the vulnerability of orphans.

The reason that this actually works because they knew Oliver had no where else to go so they knew they had an opportunity. It also worked as no one had ever been

nice to him so they were able to emotionally manipulate him.
