Friendship Dan noted that *“The Queen had a great friendship with her younger sister and with her husband Prince Philip”*.

Forgiveness Cara was able to reflect that *“The Queen showed forgiveness to her family when things may have gone wrong”*

Hope Evan told us that *“Queen Elizabeth II always showed hope in all of her speeches”*

Responsibility Jenson and Myla discussed how *“The Queen took her responsibilities very seriously, her speech during covid is a good example of this. The Queen came on television in front of her people to share with them that she had had the vaccine and to encourage us all to do the right thing, this is a very responsible thing to do”*.#

Similarly, for those wishing to leave a Floral Tribute, they can do so in the section of the Garden of Remembrance in the Churchyard that isn't covered with memorial stones, by a notice to that effect. These are of course open to staff, pupils and parents of the School. The National Guideline is that the Book of Condolences should be removed the day after the State Funeral.
