## Our Pentecost Banner

We have been invited by St Edmundsbury Cathedral to take part in their celebration of the reopening of the Cathedral to the public. To celebrate Pentecost on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> May, schools have been invited to create a colourful flame banner using the red, orange and yellow colours of Pentecost. The children in our Arts and Faith Councils drew designs for the banner reflecting the teachings and recounting of events from The Bible. The banner was made using the recycled materials which we collected over Easter, thank you for bringing these in. Every child contributed to making a part of the banner and the different languages which children share either at home or in school were used on the wings of the dove. The banner will be available for public exhibition if people are in Bury at half term.

## Toilet Twinning

Reverend Mark is a passionate supporter of the Toilet Twinning charity and the Eco Council at school are very happy to be supporting this charity and to tell you that our first twinning is with Badin in Pakistan. The idea behind Toilet Twinning is to support the entitlement of every human to have access to toilets and privacy. We are holding a fundraising event on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> May at school called 'Wear blue to skip to the loo'. Children are invited to come to school in blue clothing and to take part in a skipping challenge on this day. Suggested donation of £1 will be collected by the Eco Council towards the twinning of our next toilet. We aim to twin all toilets in the school over time and provide facilities across the world where needed.

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## Reading, Tables and Spellings

Evidence shows that learning is more successful with a short, daily revisit rather than a longer session once a week or more infrequently.

*Summer term attendance expectations for schools*

*School attendance continues to be mandatory for all pupils and the usual rules on school attendance apply. This includes parents' duty to ensure their child regularly attends school, and schools' and local authorities' ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, for poor attendance.*

*As restrictions begin to lift, we know some families may be looking to take holidays during term time. As usual, parents should plan their holidays around school breaks and avoid seeking permission to take their children out of school on holiday.*

## Updated Guidance from Suffolk County Council
